National Professional Qualification for Headship (NPQH)

Who is it for?

The Department of Education's National Professional Qualification for Headship is for senior leaders (primary, secondary, special or other settings) aspiring to headship, or for those already in post wanting to consolidate their experience with collaborative, theoretical and practical research, application and reflection

Eligibility Criteria

Participants must:

- Be highly motivated to be a headteacher, no more than 12-18 months from applying for headship posts and ready to take up a headship as soon as they complete the programme
- Have the full support and endorsement of their headteacher or line manager. Their line manager will also have to commit to playing an active role in their learning, and encourage and promote their involvement in leadership and other professional development opportunities
- Have discussed with their headteacher or line manager the requirements of the programme in terms of the tasks that will need to be completed in order to attain the qualification (see 'NPQH Content Areas, Assessment Tasks and Assessment Criteria' PDF online)

- ⦿ National recognition of their CPD as the course is accredited by the Department of Education
- ⦿ A pathway for credit transfer into a University of Leeds Masters or Doctor of Education degree

What does it involve?

The programme comprises a training day for in-school coaches, 4 full 'face-to-face' days and 2 online short courses, with additional online meetings, resources and support.
